Therefore, we are sharing this joint Memorandum to provide you with our perspective on how you can best contribute to help deliver environmental benefits across global supply chains.

Your contribution ideally includes the following measures and actions:

- Assess and disclose scope 1 and 2 emissions¹
- Set and gain verification of science-based targets aligned with the 1.5 degree pathway
- Cascade standards and expectations related to upstream suppliers for disclosure²
- Switch to renewable power in own operations to the extent possible

This Memorandum is not replacing any existing program or commitment, but it aims at disclosing our intent to scale collective action for positive change. It remains compliant with all applicable anti-trust and competition laws to the respect of which we are fully committed.
